Early Years and Education

ndrew Bamidele (AB) Oloke was born on January 3rd, 1940, to Mr Oloke Adan in Makutu Isanlu, Kogi State. He moved to Kano in 1948 with his elder brother, late Pa S.O. Oloke who trained him. He completed his primary school education in Kano 1954. He did his secondary school education in Kaduna Government Technical School. He was then admitted to Ahmadu Bello University (ABU) Zaria in 1962 where he obtained a BA degree in Fine Arts in 1966 followed by a Post Graduate Certificate in Education (PGCE) 1968. He was a seasoned athlete while at ABU where he excelled in various track and field events.

Civil Service Career and Business

His career after school began with a posting to Teachers College Sokoto. This begun a long career in the public sector spanning many cities in Northern Nigeria including Gombe, Bauchi, Maiduguri, and Yola. He taught in various educational institutions rising to the position of Principal Education Officer during this period. He was appointed the first Director of Education and posted to the then newly established Bauchi State Education Resources Center and later promoted to Chief Inspector of Education in charge of the State Ministry of Education's Inspectorate division where he served from 1981 to 1984. He served as the Chairman, Bauchi State Ministry of Education Development Committee from 1984 to 1985 when he retired and moved with his family to Ilorin to focus on his business endeavors.

In 1990 he was appointed as the Supervisory Councillor for Works, Land and Housing in the then Yagba Local Government Council in Kogi State. He was a founding member of the People Democratic Party (PDP) and remained a party elder and leader in the local government.

Pa Oloke touched many lives and made a positive impact that has transcended generations. He will be fondly remembered by all. His memory is indeed blessed.

"Nobody knows the trouble I have seen Nobody knows but Jesus I have seen the Glory Halleluya! Sometimes I'm up, sometimes I'm down o yes Lord I've had my trials here below O yes Lord."

Thank you for encouraging, defending and protecting me. You hid nothing from me, and I mean NOTHING! You helped many people and you were happy. For you, education meant everything, and you ensured helping your children and many others to achieve it.

I'm happy you were prepared to go home. You passed on peacefully in my arms.

Sleep on my beloved until we meet to part no more. Halleluyah!!

We will surely miss your fatherly advice, wise counsel and blessings. We love you forever. Good night baba.




Bola Aderele (Daughter)


